




CyberPowerPC RGB 7 Color LED Backlight Replacement

TOOLS:

- [Phillips #1 Screwdriver](#) (1)
 - [Phillips #2 Screwdriver](#) (1)
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Step 1 — Plastic Casing



 Be sure to unplug the keyboard before starting the disassembly.


- Remove the two 10 mm length screws using the Phillips head #1 which are located underneath the kickstand of the keyboard and directly next to it.

Step 2




- Remove the sixteen 5 mm length screws using the Phillips head #2.
- One of the screws may be located underneath a manufacturer's sticker.

Step 3




- Lift up and remove the plastic casing.

Step 4 — LED Backlight




- Remove the metal backing located directly underneath the white plastic casing.

Step 5



- ⚠ Be careful not to pull too hard on the ribbon cable, as it may break.
- Disconnect the ribbon cable that connects the LED board to the motherboard.

Step 6



- Carefully remove the LED board, which should now come free from the casing.

To reassemble your device, follow these instructions in reverse order.
